

GFPS, Project Implementers of DOST 7 bent to integrate GAD Guidelines in projects, programs



The members of the GAD Focal Point Members and the project implementers of DOST VII intensively involved in assessing the SETUP project using the Project Implementation, Management, Monitoring and Evaluation (PIMME) during the Harmonized Gender and Development Guidelines (HGDG) Training in Cebu City on September 4-5, 2018.

Engr. Tristan L. Abando, Cebu Provincial S & T Director said the use of the Checklist is “helpful in the identification of the gaps and weaknesses of the DOST VII SETUP project . . . the identified gaps are based on specific GAD requirements, thus, specific areas for improvement can be determined,” to serve as a guide for all project implementers towards a gender responsive project.



Engr. Jesus Zamora, Jr., Assistant Regional Director for Technical Operations of DOST VII warmly received the participants from regions six (6), seven(7), eight (8), the Philippine Science High School Campuses (PSHS) in said regions and the secretariat and officers of the DOST CO, in his welcome remarks during the Seminar-Workshop on HGDG.

The GFPS and project implementers of DOST 7 agreed to implement the following strategic interventions using the GAD guidelines, which include the need to conduct review of the program through stakeholders' consultation, utilization of sex-disaggregated data and gender-related information as baseline information for Monitoring and Evaluation, and as well as the need to conduct gender analysis in the program review.

The DOST Central Office spearheaded a two-day Training to the GFPS and project implementers of DOST Regions 6, 7, 8 and to the Philippine Science High School Campuses (PSHS) in said regions on September 4-5, 2018 at the Golden Prince Hotel in Cebu City.
