

DOST 7 employees gain info on Reproductive Diseases of Men and Women

A total of Sixty (60) participants (Male 26, Female 34) heightened their awareness on the Reproductive Diseases of Men and Women on an Orientation conducted on April 30, 2019 at the DOST VII Conference Hall, Sudlon, Lahug, Cebu City. The activity was spearheaded by the Department of Science and Technology Region 7 to ensure that the employees of DOST are provided with relevant information regarding reproductive diseases that may affect the performance of their professional duties.

Angelie Brook U. Cejudo, Senior Health Program Officer on Non-Communicable Diseases of the Department of Health Region 7, shared the four most prevailing reproductive diseases of women which include, urinary tract infection, polycystic ovarian syndrome, breast and ovarian cancer. Ms. Cejudo also discussed about prostate cancer, one of the most dominant reproductive ailment of men.

The participants were made aware on the common symptoms, who are at risks, diagnostic tools used, the complications, prevention and treatment of the reproductive diseases of men and women.

The attendees also actively took part during the open forum of the event to which they inquired and was informed about the health effects of the recurring urinary tract infection, the reason of infertility, hormonal imbalance, and if infection from mumps and tonsillitis are the likely culprit of infertility.
