The training seeks to train the project implementers on how to mainstream Gender Responsive Programming among its clientele in the province of Cebu, Bohol, Siquijor and Negros Oriental.

To effectively integrate gender and development in S & T, the implementers enhanced their awareness on the need to, integrate gender analysis and gender-responsive actions into programme design, build the capacity of clients to respond to gender inequalities, ensure access of men and women to S & T programs and services, provide equal participation of men and women in scientific work, develop gender-sensitive monitoring and evaluation, and the need to advocate for the issuance and implementation of gender-responsive policies in client’s workplaces.
